

Genealogical Studies Programme at the Centre for Lifelong Learning



The Genealogical Studies Programme offers a variety of educational pathways:

- 8-week online (and campus based) courses at the beginner to intermediate level.
- A postgraduate programme offered in 3 steps:
 Certificate, Diploma and MSc. All steps are online.
- CPD webinars are being developed in 2016-17.

Beginner to Intermediate 8-week courses



- Courses start in October, January and April
- Some courses have a Scottish focus but also cover UK wide sources.
- Topics: an Introduction to Family History research, Using technology in Family History, Beyond the Basics, an Intro to Genetic Genealogy & an Intro to Heraldry.

Beginner to Intermediate 8-week courses



- Entry requirements: none but familiarity with using the Internet and having a reasonably strong connection will help.
- Cost for 2016-17, £159 per 8-week course.

Genealogical, Palaeographic and Heraldic Studies Postgraduate Programme



The programme provides a thorough grounding in the theory and practice of genealogical research. Focus is on expertise in searching, recording and presenting results.

The Programme is broken into 3 steps which together form the MSc degree:

- PG Cert focused on UK records and research.
- PG Diploma extends beyond the UK.
- MSc step dissertation topic is chosen by student

Programme Steps



- PG Cert part time over 1-year (20 hrs/week) or modular over 2-3 years (14 hrs/week). Foundation step.
- PG Diploma part time over 1-year (20 hrs/week).
- MSc level part time over 1-year (hrs vary)

Most people have to begin at the PG Cert.

Entry direct to PG Diploma *is* possible but needs Cert equivalent Part time programme takes 3-5 years for an MSc.

Fulltime MSc: do all 3 steps in one year (35-40 hrs per week)

Learning and Teaching



- The programme is delivered entirely online.
- Teaching materials include written lectures and multimedia presentations along with discussion forums and chat sessions.
- Students are assigned a tutor who provides feedback and support.
- There are no exams, assessment is largely practical in nature with academic research projects on the PG Diploma and MSc levels.



Student IT requirements



You'll need:

- Access to a reliable computer PC or PC compatible from home with a good Internet connection
- The ability to run applications such as Adobe Connect, Adobe Reader and a Media Player
- Ability to subscribe to certain online databases (though we normally arrange some free access for PG Cert students).
- Willingness to use genealogical software; Family Tree Maker is the course standard.

Entry Requirements



- Normally we require a degree or similar evidence of study skills, however non-standard educational or professional qualifications will be considered. Training through work could very well qualify.
- Some experience in genealogical (or other relevant)
 research is required. We look for a range of sources used
 and a level of comfort with communicating results.

- MSc (part time; post PG Dip), UK/EU £2,000; Int. £3,500
